Congratulations to Kyle Davis of Kennett Square, Pa., the recipient of the 2006 W.C. Fownes, Jr., Player of the Year Award. Davis earned the year-end honor, in part, on the strength of an impressive victory in the Pennsylvania Open Championship at Nemaquin at Woodlands Resort Mystic Rock Course where he became the first amateur to capture the Open since R. Jay Sigel did so in 1990 at Rolling Green GC. Davis's summer also included a second-place tie in the Amateur Championship, advancing to the third round of the U.S. Amateur Championship before falling to eventual champion Richie Ramsey of Scotland and tying for fifth in the Eastern Amateur in Virginia which included a second-round score of 60 (10-under par).

In addition to Davis, I would also like to recognize Arnold Cutrell, Jeff Daniels, Bill Lawler, Chip Lutz, George E. "Buddy" Marucci, Jr., Scott Mayne, William Miller, Clayton Rotz, Paul Schlachter and Nathan Smith for advancing to match play in various USGA Championships.

3rd R. Jay Sigel Match Play Championship

Totteridge GC – Greensburg, Pa.
May 8-10, 2006

Greensburg, Pa.-Arnold Cutrell of Totteridge GC (par 72, 7,063 yards) faced a pair of challengers in the R. Jay Sigel Match Play Championship final. His opponent in the title match was Nathan Smith of Pinecrest CC, one of the Keystone state's top players and a recent U.S. Middle-Amateur Champion (2003). Also present, and serving as another advisory of sorts, was the pressure one experience's from competing for a championship on a home course.

"Nathan is one of best players in the state and to beat him in the final was nice," said Cutrell of his 3&2 victory. "It is easy to say there is a home course advantage and you should win but to go out and do it when everyone expects you to do so is tough." "I was just happy to live up to the expectations. Cutrell, who captured the 2005 Match Play title at Stonewall over Glenn Smeraglio of Yardley CC, never trailed in this year's Championship match on a firm and fast Totteridge GC.

He rolled in a 10-foot birdie on the first hole (par 4, 429 yards) for a 1-up lead and added a two-putt birdie on the par 5, 4th hole (496 yards) for a 2-up edge. Smith battled back and cut the deficit to one with a birdie on No. 5 (par 3, 157 yards) after knocking in a curling 30-foot birdie. Cutrell responded to Smith's salvo right away on No. 6 (par 4, 362 yards) with another birdie from about 10 feet. A three-putt Cutrell bogey on No. 8 (par 3, 202 yards) and par on No. 9 (par 4, 447 yards) combined with a Smith par and birdie, respectively, on those holes made the match All Square at the turn.

"When I got it back to All Square there was that possibility [of winning]," said Smith, "but Arnie just played well all day."

Cutrell then regained control of the match for good on No. 11 (par 4, 363 yards).

He knocked a sand wedge from 90 yards to about 15 feet and made the right to left birdie putt.

"I was in the mindset that I had to capitalize on all my opportunities," said Cutrell, 42, of Greensburg, Pa. "Nathan is such a good player I knew I had to play well the whole way. Sometimes in match play you can coast and wait for your opponent to make a mistake but I knew I couldn't do that with him."

Cutrell went 2-up with five holes remaining when he knocked a Gap Wedge from 115 yards out on No. 13 (par 4, 464 yards) to about 15 feet and made that putt.

"That was one of the toughest holes on the course and for him to make birdie there was a big turning point," said Smith, 28, of Pittsburgh, Pa. "He played great."

Added Cutrell, "It starts going through your head how you can finish this as fast as possible. I know Nathan is famous for making great comebacks and I just wanted to end it."

The two exchanged pars on the next two holes before Cutrell closed Smith out on No. 16 (par 3, 184 yards).

"I made two really good 3-3½-4 footers on Nos. 14 (par 3, 215 yards) and 15 (par 5, 567 yards) that if I missed I would've opened the door for a comeback. Those really helped me sustain the lead and close him out."

This was the third R. Jay Sigel Match Play Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers. The event heads East next year to Gulph Mills GC in King of Prussia, Pa.

FLEETWOOD, Pa.—Chad Bricker of Waynesboro CC didn't let the sweltering heat or an occasional wayward shot alter his frame of mind. Bricker, who entered the final round of the 93rd Amateur Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers at Moselem Springs GC (par 70, 6,824 yards) as the co-leader, kept his cool, per se, hitting mainly irons off tees and making clutch up-and-downs to finish at 2-under par (208) for the 54 holes and earn the title of Pennsylvania State Champion.

Bricker, a sophomore at Penn State University, was the only competitor in the 132-player field (the field was cut to the low 40 players and ties after Round 2 with 46 players advancing) to finish the three rounds in red figures. Kyle Davis of Inniscrone GC and Chris Schultz of Fox Chase GC tied for second place at even par (210).

"I talked to a reporter last week and he asked me the same question, 'What my goal was this week,'" said Bricker, 19, of Waynesboro, Pa. "I said I wanted to win just like everyone else. This feels awesome."

Bricker is the first Waynesboro CC member to earn the Amateur trophy.

The soft-spoken right-hander executed a flawless game plan the entire three days.

Not looking to put himself in trouble off the tee, he left his driver in the bag for the vast majority of each round. In fact, in the final 18 holes he hit it only three times. He

also never panicked when a bounce or two didn't go his way.

En route to the title, Bricker made key par saves on Nos. 10 (par 4, 307 yards), 12 (par 5, 515 yards) and 13 (par 3, 224 yards). His final round of even-par 70 included both a pair of birdies and bogeys.

"I couple of times I lost [my focus] today, but I was able to get it back," said Bricker. "I kept setting new goals

[throughout the round.]"

As the intense heat built throughout the day, Bricker and Schultz managed to separate themselves from the pack. Schultz, in the second to last pairing of the afternoon, and in the group ahead of Bricker, moved to 2-under par and into a tie for the lead with a fantastic three on the difficult and treacherous par 4, 442-yard 14th. Schultz hit a 5-iron from 176 yards to 12 feet left of the hole and made the putt.

However, after missing a birdie opportunity on No. 16 (par 4, 412 yards), he stubbed his toe on the final two holes and recorded a pair of bogeys. On the 17th (par 4, 412 yards) he three putted from 50-plus feet after his approach, which looked perfect from the fairway, caught the slope of the green and ran away from the hole. On the scenic, downhill 18th (par 4, 456 yards), his second shot landed long and left and in a slight depression in the ground. He failed to get up-and-down.

"This was excellent," said Schultz, 34, of Shillington, Pa. "I had

no expectations coming in here."

Davis, 20, of Kennett Square, Pa., is a sophomore at the University of Central Florida.

However, Davis, usually Mr. Reliable with the putter, couldn't get the ball into the hole in any of the three rounds. He recorded 30 final-round putts and a shocking 93 over the three days.

Davis, who shared the lead with Bricker after two rounds, finished with a 2-over-par 72.

Bricker can thank his cool head on the three aforementioned holes as the keys to victory.

On the 10th, after a poor drive, he managed to cut his 6-iron approach shot into the wind from 175 yards and land it 15 feet from the hole. He made par. On the 12th, another bad drive saw him land in the right tree line. But Bricker punched out, landed his 6-iron some 10 feet from the cup and two putted for another par. Then, after his 4-iron landed just over the front bunker on the 13th, he got up-and-down for three and another par.

90th Pennsylvania Open

Nemacolin at Woodlands Resort (Mystic Rock) – Farmington, Pa. Qualifying results page, 27-28
Aug. 14-16, 2006

FARMINGTON, Pa.—Kyle Davis of Kennett Square, Pa., 20, a sophomore at the University of Central Florida, emerged from a compact, and at times crazy, leaderboard to capture the 90th Pennsylvania Open Championship at the challenging Nemacolin at Woodlands Resort Mystic Rock Course (par 72, 7,049 yards). Davis finished the 54 holes in 6-under par (210 total), four shots clear of the field, and became the first amateur to capture the State Open title since R. Jay Sigel did so in 1990 at Rolling Green GC.

“This means a lot. I was looking at the Web site a couple of days ago and I saw an amateur hadn’t won since 1990,” said Davis. “I can’t believe that. There are so many good amateurs in Pennsylvania. It’s great to have my name on the trophy.”

Davis, a member of Imiscoe GC, earned that right with a splendid finish.

Two shots up on defending Open Champion and clubhouse leader Sean Farren of Oakmont, Pa. with three holes to go, Davis drained a 30-foot, left-to-right downhill birdie chance on No. 16 (par 5, 517 yards) to create some more breathing room. He unofficially sealed the tournament on the ensuing 17th, a scary par 3 (201 yards) with water down the left side, when he juiced a 6-iron over the hole that stopped 18 feet past the cup. He drained the downhill and the championship was his.

“Yesterday, I hit 14 greens and was on the fringe on two holes, so I knew if

I could get the ball rolling I would be in good shape,” said Davis. “The greens here are really subtle. I needed to find the lines with my eyes and I did that on 16 and 17.” He recorded 27 putts on the final day.

Earlier in the back nine Davis broke away from a clustered pack. In fact, at various times of the day five different players held the final round’s top spot: Davis, touring pro Scott Ehrlich of Blue Bell, Pa., Butler CC assistant professional Robert McClellan of Butler, Pa., second-round leader Jon Pratkanis of Butler, Pa. and Spring Ford CC assistant professional Rich Steinmetz of Gilbertsville, Pa.

Davis drew clear with his deft touch and short game.

He birdied No. 10 (par 4, 438 yards), when he knocked a sand wedge to six feet, and No. 11 (par 5, 613 yards), when he hit a wedge from 50 yards out to five feet to move to 5-under for the tournament. A bogey on the ensuing and treacherous 12th hole (par 3, 166 yards) cost him a stroke but Davis finished in a flurry with those two birdies in the final three holes.

“To get another win this summer is great,” added a smiling Davis. “I’m not complaining, but I’ve played so well that I knew if I kept putting myself into position it would turn over.”

It certainly has been quite a summer for the Davis household. Davis captured the Golf Association of Philadelphia’s (GAP) Amateur Championship in June, placed third in the GAP Open Championship in July and tied for second in that Association’s stroke play championship, the Patterson Cup, last Thursday. Two weeks prior he placed second in the State Amateur Championship at Moslem Springs GC and last Monday qualified for his first U.S. Amateur Championship. He ad-

Davis' lone challenge on the final day came from Farren. Playing three groups ahead of the eventual champion, the 37-year-old head professional from

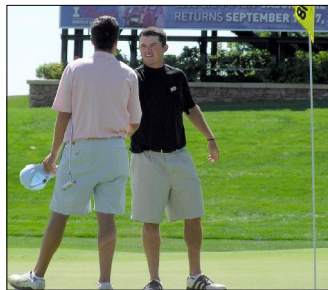

Totteridge GC carded five birdies and two bogeys to jump up from a tie for 10th to second in the final standings.

He was looking to become the first back-to-back since John Weitzel of Hershey GC did so in 1955-56.

"I had a great pairing with Kevin [Shields, who is a teaching pro and does some work out of Totteridge GC as well]. I thought 67 would be a great score today," said Farren. "The best part about being this far ahead of the leaders is posting a score so everyone [on the course] knows it."

Farren opened his round with three birdies on the front side: No. 1 (par 4, 368 yards), a 15 footer; No. 5 (par 5, 504 yards), he hit a pitching wedge

from 123 yards to an inch; and No. 9 (par 4, 415 yards), a 144-yard pitching wedge to eight feet. Farren gave a shot back with a bogey on the very difficult par 3, 12th but Farren rebounded with a three on the par 4, 13th (369 yards) to move back to 3-under for the tournament. Farren three-putted the challenging 14th green for

a bogey but again responded in style with a 140-yard, 9-iron to five feet for a birdie on No. 15 (par 4, 433 yards).

Jon Pratkanis, the 20-year-old amateur from Butler, Pa., who held the lead at the conclusion of each of the first two days, opened bogey, double bogey, bogey to fall out of contention. He finished in a tie for third.

MALVERN, Pa—James Sullivan, Jr. of Huntingdon Valley CC expected a phone call from his pregnant wife, who is only a week shy of her due date, announcing the impending arrival of the couple's fourth child. If that had happened at some point of the second and final round of the 13th Pennsylvania Golf Association Middle-Amateur Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers at Applebrook GC, Sullivan said he would have packed up his clubs and headed to the hospital.

Just a few weeks earlier, in fact, a false alarm forced Sullivan to withdraw from the Golf Association of Philadelphia's Joseph H.

Patterson Cup at Philmont CC where he was in contention.

Sullivan's phone never rang, however, and the first-round co-leader overcame a four-shot mid-round deficit to Paul Schlachter of The Club at Nevillewood for his first state championship.

Sullivan finished the 36 holes at 6-under par. He carded a second-round 4-under-par 67 to outdistance second-place finisher Schlachter by two strokes. Michael McDermott of Merion GC finished third at 2-under par. Jeff Daniels of Dauphin Highlands GC was the only other finisher in red numbers. He posted a 1-under 141 total.

A field of 120 players competed.

"This means so much to me," said Sullivan, 31, of Huntingdon Valley, Pa. "To go head-to-head with guys like Paul [Schlachter] and Michael [McDermott], two of the top four or five players in the state for the last five or 10 years, and win is special."

Ten holes into the final round, Schlachter, who along with Sullivan and James Bohn of Bucknell GC were paired in the final group, appeared headed for his sixth state championship.

Schlachter birdied six of his first nine holes to make the turn at 7-under par for the tournament while Sullivan was at 3 under for that span. Both players also went on to birdie No. 10 (par 5, 573 yards).

"I didn't get wrapped up in it," said Sullivan of Schlachter's unbelievable first 10 holes. "I wasn't panicking. That wouldn't do any good. I was playing pretty well myself."

The tournament was ultimately decided on the challenging three-hole stretch of Nos. 13-15.

On the 13th (par 4, 453 yards), a poor drive and a short par putt miss by Schlachter brought Sullivan within two strokes. On the treacherous 14th (par 4, 444 yards)

momentum clearly swung Sullivan's way when Schlachter's tee ball found the right fescue. Sullivan split the fairway. Schlachter then needed two shots to get out of the junk and registered a double-bogey six. Sullivan watched his 20-foot birdie chance slide right but when the hole was over, the two competitors were tied.

"I had a good lie [in the fescue]. The ball was sitting up," said Schlachter, 57, of Bridgeville, Pa., who was bidding to become the third person to repeat as Mid-Am Champion, "but my 56-degree wedge went right underneath it. It surprised me. I thought I could get it out."

Sullivan watched his 4-iron on the lengthy 16th (par 3, 224 yards) stay just on the front portion of the green and he two putted for his par. Schlachter rock-

eted a 17-degree rescue wood to the top, right of the green and was left with a difficult 50-foot downhill. Schlachter's first effort came up five-feet short and he missed the par putt. Sullivan had the lead.

Sullivan poured it on with birdies on No. 16 (par 5, 578 yards) and 17 (par 3, 179 yards). Schlachter watched birdie chances on 17 and 18 (par 4, 454 yards), both within five feet, just slip past the edge of the hole.

The win capped a rebirth, of sorts, for Sullivan in the amateur ranks.

Sullivan was reinstated as an amateur almost exactly a year ago after competing on various mini-tours for a few years. He submitted his amateur status papers in October of 2002 and his first tournament back in the amateur ranks was the Pennsylvania Mid-Am last year.

Sullivan won the Golf Association of Philadelphia's Silver Cross in 1996 and the Amateur Championship in 1999.

MOOSIC, Pa.- Michael Vassil of the CC of Scranton carded an even-par total of 142 (69-73) under cool, wet conditions at Glenmaura National GC (par 71, 6,554 yards) to outlast a feisty Glenn Smeraglio of Yardley CC by one stroke in the second Hemlock Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers.

Arthur Kania, Jr. of Overbrook GC carded a 1-under-par 70, the only sub-par round of the second day, to finish in third place with a 5-over-par 147 (77-70). John Zavada of Elkview CC and Drew Panebianco of Talamore at Oak Terrace CC finished in fourth and fifth place, respectively.

But it was Vassil who picked up right where he left off after yesterday's under-par performance, scorching the front nine with birdies on hole Nos. 1 (par 5, 557 yards), 6 (par 5, 516 yards), 7 (par 3, 173 yards) and 9 (par 3, 167 yards). He made the turn at 2 under, extending his lead to four strokes through 27 holes.

"Coming in I knew I had one more mistake to make than everyone else," said the 49-year-old from Dalton, Pa. "I played real solid on the front with four birdies. You really pick up on the field making twos on the par 3s."

But as the rain continued to fall and the temperature began to drop, Vassil saw his lead quickly diminish after an errant tee shot on No. 10 (par 5, 542 yards) went into the right-side hazard. From that point the only thing Vassil could salvage was a double bogey as Smeraglio saved

par and closed the gap by two strokes. Smeraglio was two back.

"When we got to the tee, the hardest rain of the day started," Vassil said. "I didn't take care of winding myself up and I just blocked it into the hazard, and it went in there early so I was way back.

"I made a double on that and it kind of unnerves you a bit."

Vassil's lead was cut in half yet again after carding a bogey on No. 12 (par 4, 377 yards) while a steady Smeraglio registered his 10th par of the day to bring himself within a stroke of the leader.

"I thought I had a chance," Smeraglio said. "I thought the momentum was beginning to swing there."

Added Vassil, "I was really going south in the middle. But making that

bogey putt allowed me to keep the lead and it was something positive to take away from it."

Smeraglio continued his stable play with two more pars before making only his second bogey of the afternoon on No. 15 (par 3, 211 yards).

Meanwhile, Vassil quickly capitalized on Smeraglio's mistake and scored his third birdie of the afternoon on the course's five par 3s when he hit his 4-iron to 12 feet right of the hole to give him a three-stroke lead with three to play.

"Making twos here is like a shot and a half on most other par 3s," Vassil said. "You get a lot of mileage out of that."

Vassil made things interesting with bogeys on No. 17 (par 4, 337 yards) and No. 18 (par 4, 358 yards) while Smeraglio finished off with a pair of pars. However, it was still good enough to win by a shot.

Vassil who three putted No. 18, finished the day at 2-over-par 73.

"That bogey [on No. 17] really opened the door so I was kicking myself," he said. "I can't ever make things easy on myself."

The Hemlock, an event named after the Pennsylvania state tree, is for players ages 45-54 years old.

67th George Dressler Amateur Public Links

HARRISBURG, Pa.—On a day better suited to fly a kite, Thomas Timby, Jr. of Makefield Highlands GC overcame 40-mph wind gusts to win the 67th George Dressler Pennsylvania Amateur Public Links Championship, presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers, at Dauphin Highlands GC with an even-par 144 (70-74).



Playing in only his second Pennsylvania Golf Association event, Timby, 36, bested the 83-player field and the adverse conditions with a somewhat reserved approach to his second day at the Harrisburg course.

"I never saw [Dauphin Highlands] until I showed up to play that Saturday," said Timby, a medical sales rep. from Doylestown, Pa. "The winds were a lot stronger Sunday. So when I was on the range I tried to keep [the ball] down and play a three-quarter

shot to keep it in play and hope my short game would take care of the rest."

The strategy seemed to pay off as Timby remained atop the leaderboard at 3 under through 29 holes when he dropped his seventh birdie of the tournament on No. 11 (par 4, 412 yards).

In keeping with his strategy, Timby kept his drive low, then played a punch 6-iron from 166 yards out to within three feet left of the cup for birdie.

"Given the conditions, I thought it would be difficult to finish at even par for the tournament," said Timby, who qualified for last year's USGA Mid-Amateur Championship.

Timby was informed of his three-stroke lead after his par putt on No. 14 (par 4, 375 yards) left him at 2 under for the tournament.

Unfortunately for Timby, his lead dwindled after back-to-back bogeys on Nos. 15 (par 3, 188 yards) and 16 (par 5, 580 yards) shrunk his lead to one stroke over defending champion Peter Toole of Mount Joy, Pa.

"I still had to stay aggressive," Timby said. "But it was difficult not to go into protection mode at that point. I thought I blew it with [those bogeys]."

Timby went on to par the remain-

PITTSBURGH, Pa.—A determined Stu Michaels and Josh Norris of Clearfield-Curwensville CC edged a feisty Eric Williams and Jim Gardas of Honesdale GC in a sudden death, two-hole playoff to take the 17th Pennsylvania Better-Ball

Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers at Edgewood CC (par 70, 6,491 yards).

With inclement weather shortening the event to an 18-hole contest for the fourth time in its history and the third time in the last four years, Michaels and Norris bested a field of 41 other teams to win the championship.

Norris sealed the vic-

tory for the Clearfield-Curwensville CC duo after he knocked his approach shot on the second playoff hole (No. 10, par 4, 335 yards) to within a foot for birdie.

"We were excited to be in a playoff. The only thing we had to wait almost two hours for the playoff to begin," said Norris, who hails from Clearfield, Pa.

"It is an honor to be fortunate enough to win the Pennsylvania Better-Ball Championship. It's nice to show that players from Central Pennsylvania can compete with some of the best amateur golfers in the state."

Michaels and Norris carded a 5-under-par 30 on

the back nine to finish at 3-under-par 67. The pair strung together six birdies, Nos. 11 (par 4, 398 yards), 12 (par 3, 171 yards), 13 (par 4, 399 yards), 15 (par 4, 341 yards), 16 (par 5, 471 yards) and 17 (par 4, 470 yards), to tie Williams and Gardas and force a playoff.

"We hung on through the front nine while we struggled with the course and the conditions," Norris said. "Stu made about a 20-foot putt for bogey on the second hole (par 4, 427 yards) to avoid an early disaster. That was key because we then were able to get hot on the back nine, making five birdies in the last eight holes."

Williams and Gardas had some success of their own carding four birdies and only one bogey before heading to extra play.

"We played in and out very well," said Gardas, 30, from Hawley, Pa. "We birdied Nos. 9 (par 4, 307 yards), 10, 12 and 13 and felt very good about our chances in a playoff, since the conditions were not that great (occasional rain, heavy at times). Eric [Williams] was hitting his driver long and straight all day and we had birdied the two playoff holes earlier in the day."

After Gardas found the fairway and was able to make par on the first playoff hole (No. 9, par 4, 307 yards), Michaels, who shot a 1-under-par 69 on his own

ball, found himself in a rather precarious situation in the long wet rough. Nonetheless, the 23-year-old from Curwensville, Pa., was

able to save par and halve the hole before the team captured the title on the next playoff hole (No. 10) when Norris stuck his lob wedge from 80-yards out to within a foot for birdie. "Stu hit a great shot on the first playoff hole out of the hay to inside 10 feet," Norris said. "His putt just slipped by the hole and we halved it. On the second playoff hole, I was able to hit my second shot within a foot of the hole and make birdie for the win."

Of note, former champions (1999) Artie Fink and Greg Ferguson of Sinking Valley CC and Paul Mazeski and Mark Bope of Oakmont CC were one stroke back with a 2-under-par 68.

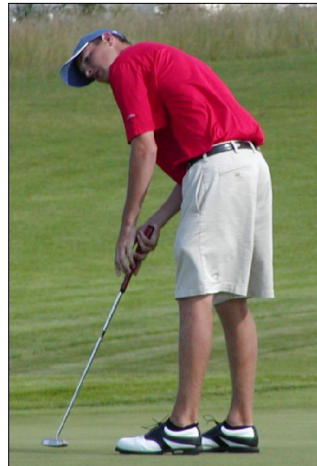

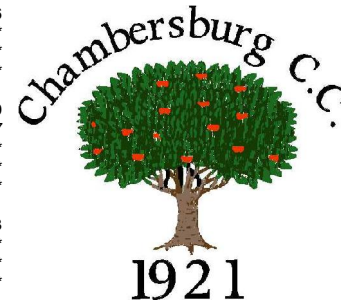

47th Senior Amateur Championship

Waynesborough Country Club – Paoli, Pa.
Aug. 9-10, 2006

Rarely are the initial two holes of a final round the determining factor in a championship.

However, when the leaders of the Senior Amateur Championship presented by Your Pennsylvania Toyota Dealers teed off on the second day at Waynesborough CC (par 71, 6,525 yards), they did so at the beginning of an intense 45-minute rainstorm that was so strong even visibility became an issue.

That serving as the back-ground, Paul Schlachter of The Club at Neville-wood, playing in the final group, called the two pars on his opening two holes the championship difference. Schlachter made a pair of 10-foot par savers in the pouring rain en route to an even-par 71 and 140 total, finishing five shots clear of runner-up William Lawler of Fox Hill CC. To back up Schlachter's statement on how difficult conditions were, Lawler, also a member of the final trio to hit the golf course and Schlachter's nearest competitor after Round 1 (he was four shots back after shooting an opening round 73), carded a pair of decisive double bogeys on the initial two holes.

"That was the key to the round," Schlachter said of his start. "I actually increased the distance between [myself and the field] by making pars."

Added Lawler, "I knew I needed to

get off to a good start to put any pressure on [Schlachter]. He's world class. The long and short of it is the sky opened and I was 5 over after three holes."

Schlachter's victory was his fifth career state title and second Senior

A m a t e u r Championship (2004). The 58-year-old of Bridgeville, Pa. also won the 1998 State Amateur, the 2005 State Mid-Amateur and

was a member of the 2005 State Senior Better-Ball team winners.

"Next to national events, these are the biggest events I have," said Schlachter, a retired school teacher. "And after being fortunate to win a couple tournaments, you realize how hard it is to win a [state championship]."

Schlachter opened his 2006 march with a 2-under-par 69 in the first round, including a 3 under stretch in his final eight holes in which he birdied No. 11 (par 4, 391 yards), No. 12 (par 4, 341 yards) – he hit a sand wedge from 60 yards to two inches – and No. 13 (par 4, 401 yards).

That afforded Schlachter a four-stroke lead after the first 18 holes.

The early rain then gave the ultra-consistent Schlachter a bigger cushion.

He carded a 1-under 34 on his opening nine holes of the final round

before carding a double-bogey five on the par 3, 144-yard 14th hole. By that time, however, the result was well in hand.

"I played steady, putted reasonably well and didn't make any mistakes I couldn't overcome," said Schlachter. "[When I have a lead] I try not to take any unnecessary risks. I try to be more careful."

George Bilowick of Butler CC earned the Super-Senior Division Championship (par 71, 6,273 yards), for players 55 years of age and older, with a 148 total (6-over par), a shot clear of Don Lamb of St. Clair CC and Richard Smith of Philadelphia CC.

Bilowick, the first-round leader by two strokes, needed pars on the final two holes to secure a victory and did just that.

Clayton Rotz of Chambersburg CC and Cameron Peterson of Oakview GC finished in a three-way tie for second in the individual standings to guide the Pennsylvania Golf Association to a runner-up showing in the 43rd A. Fred Williamson Cup at Bellevue Country Club in Syracuse, N.Y. It was the third consecutive year Team Pennsylvania has earned runner-up honors. The Pennsylvania Golf Association won the 2003 Williamson Cup.

Both Peterson and Rotz posted two-round totals of 5-over par. Peterson shot rounds of 75-72 for a 147 total while Rotz carded a 73-74 (147 total) on the challenging Bellevue CC layout (par 71, 6,540 yards). Fellow Team Pennsylvania member Matthew Rebitch of Cherry Creek GC tied for 12th (77-74–151) while teammate James Kania, Jr. of Overbrook GC tied for 14th (78-77–155).

“I was disappointed that we didn’t win the Williamson Cup, it being my last year and all,” said Rotz. “But we played well. I’m sure all four of us thought we played the biggest part in the team not winning but you have to remember it is just that, a team event.”

The A. Fred Williamson Cup started in 1964 as a 36-hole junior competition between five regional golf associations.

This year a total of 10 teams from various regional and state associations took part: Delaware; Metropolitan, N.Y.; Ontario; Pennsylvania; Philadelphia; Western Pennsylvania; Quebec; Rochester; Syracuse and Washington Metropolitan.

The Western Pennsylvania Golf Association is the host organization for the 2007 Williamson Cup.

W.C. Fownes, Jr. Amateur Player of the Year

Kyle Davis – Inniscrone Golf Club

Kyle Davis, 20, a resident of Kennett Square, Pa. and a member of Inniscrone GC, earned his first William C. Fownes, Jr. Player of the Year Award after a season in which he amassed an astounding 950 total points (in just four events), 485 more than his closest competitor.

The highlight of Davis's remarkable campaign came at the 90th Open Championship when he became the first amateur to capture a State Open since R. Jay Sigel did so in 1990. Davis earned 450 points for the win in which he blitzed a contentious field at the Nemacolin at Woodlands Resort Mystic Rock course by four strokes with a masterful iron display.

Just a couple week's prior, Davis recorded 250 points at the State Amateur with a runner-up finish. Davis entered the final round deadlocked for the lead before tying for second.

Days after his Open victory, Davis traveled to Hazeltine National GC in Chaska, Minn., and advanced to the third round of the U.S. Amateur before falling to eventual champion

Richie Ramsay of Aberdeen, Scotland. He earned 200 more points.

Davis also earned 50 Player of the Year points for a top five finish at the Eastern Amateur Championship in Portsmouth, Va. He carded a course-record, 10-under-par 60 in the second round of that event.

"It means a lot to me to be recognized as the Player of the Year for the Pennsylvania Golf Association," said Davis, who was also named the 2006 Golf Association of Philadelphia William Hyndman, III Player of the Year. "It means so much, especially because of all of the hard work and time I have put into my game over the last year.

"It was a great week. It was very special to have my mom, grandparents, aunt and uncle there to watch me. I couldn't have scripted it better."

Davis's success this season can be attributed in part to a strong work ethic and a couple tweaks of his swing.

"A lot of my success came though practice and the work I put in, especially my short game," said Davis, a left-hander who is a sophomore at

the University of Central Florida. "That along with some fundamental swing changes have allowed me to become more consistent.

"The PA Amateur was a big help for me in order to learn how to win in a stroke play event. I learned a lot by watching [champion] Chad [Bricker] and how he kept himself composed during the last round of the Amateur. That knowledge helped me close the deal at the State Open."

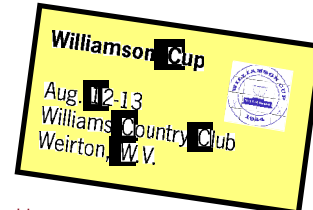
